





## **Applying to Graduate School in the US**



- Typically, graduate school is free for STEM students. This includes international students who qualify (GPA, GRE, SoP)
- In this talk we plan to cover
  - Minimum GPA and GRE scores, what to study, where to apply, how many places to apply, financial assistance, statement of purpose, finding a research advisor, etc.
  - What is the timeline and steps to follow to secure admission and financial support at a graduate institution in the US?



## Talking Points (1/3)

- 1. Does it matter what I study in graduate school?
- 2. How do I pay for my graduate education? Why get a PhD?
- 3. How many applications?
- 4. GPA and GRE (Q > 155 over 70%, V > 153 over 50%, A ideally > 4 / 6)
- 5. Do your homework
  - Communicate with students of professors
    - How does professor guide students?
    - How does professor help students get jobs?
    - How does professor relate to students?
    - What are the professor's current research interests?
  - Tailor make your communication with professor
- 6. Tailor your statement of purpose to the professor and the institution. Copy the professor's student you have communicated with
- 7. Focus on how you can add value to the professor's research program and what will distinguish you from others.





## Talking Points (2/3)

#### 8. Timeline – Ideal Scenario

- You need to start the application process a year before you plan to join the graduate program. To start in Fall 2022 you need to start working on your application in Summer 2021
- Summer / Fall 2021 GRE, TOEFL, identify about a dozen schools that you may apply to
- Find out about program and professors from students that are already enrolled in the graduate program
- Prepare statement of purpose show how you can add value to the research program at the institution in general and selected professors in particular
- Plan on applying to eight schools. Three dream schools, three good schools and two back-up schools
- Apply you have a better chance of getting admission with financial assistance the earlier you apply. No matter what is stated on the website the last date for applications to be considered is December 31, 2021
- Most invitations go out by end of February / early March with a deadline to accept / not accept of April 15







#### 9. Financial Aid

- Research Assistantships specific, knowledge, skills and interest needed
- Teaching Assistantships specific knowledge as well as knowledge of English
- Scholarships usually small, based on merit and sometimes other qualifications, such as country or origin, gender, community activities, etc.

#### International students

- Loans can be hard to get for international students
- Work restricted to work on campus for international students jobs such as work in library, in cafeteria, in parking lot, etc. Maximum 20 hours a week. Typically, paid at a minimum hourly rate. Will not be enough to cover living and tuition





## **UK – Graduate Program Overview**

#### **PhD - Application**

- Apply for an existing PhD position with funding
- Apply to a supervisor and seek funding separately

#### **PhD – Types of Programs**

Integrated PhD a year-long project resulting in a Masters/MPhil or onto a three-year PhD.

Professional Doctorate is for students planning on working in professional jobs such as engineers and architects or in medicine and teaching

PhD by Publication is based on original, scholarly publications and present them in the same style as a <a href="https://php.ncm.nih.gov/PhD">PhD thesis</a>.

#### **Example - University of Cambridge**

Some institutions require you to identify a suitable supervisor before you submit your application.

- Course: The admission process starts on September 1
- 2. Deadlines: Application deadline and the funding deadline.
- 3. Applicant Portal and Research Proposal
- Academic references (2)
- 5. Colleges <u>two College preferences</u> or open
- Apply: A number of the University's major sources of funding can be applied for through the Applicant Portal.

## UK - Research Proposal



Your research proposal: a specific question and how it proposes to build on earlier research What is your topic? Demonstrate knowledge of the field.

What questions do you want to answer? Demonstrate need for further research.

What is the key literature and its limitations?

What are the main hypotheses of the work?

What methodology do you intend to use? Most topics will involve an application of the proposed methods to a substantive research question. Give a brief outline of this question and explain how it will benefit from this particular approach.

What theoretical/conceptual framework will you adopt?

What are your case studies, if any, and what are your case selection criteria?

What previous research have you undertaken in this field? Be specific about the training and skills you have to undertake the proposed research (do not simply list courses attended: this information is already available in the CV and transcripts).



## **UK – Requirement Examples**

#### LSE begins in October rolling

Requirement: MSc (taught) statistics academic achievements research proposal statement of academic purpose references CV sample of written work

## Salient Features – Statement of Purpose

Typically one to one and a half pages, that is, 400 to 600 words.



- **Para 1** What degree do you want and why. What do you plan to do after getting your degree.
- **Para 2** Your academic preparation for what you wish to study and your accomplishments.
- **Para 3** Your extracurricular activities and how these have shaped who you are.
- **Para 4** Particularize to the program you are applying to. Why this institution? Which professors interest you? Much of this information will come from your exploration of the web.
- **Para 5** Summary statement as to what you plan to do professionally and why this place is just right for you.





### Statement of Purpose - Some institutions require short one paragraph essays



- 1. Read the prompt for the essay.
- 2. Write the prompt for the essay in a word document or sheet of paper.
- 3. Reflect with a view to understanding the prompt.
- 4. Do a mind dump of what you could include in your essay. Could be sentences or bullet points.
- 5. Organize these ideas into categories that will morph into paragraphs.
- 6. Reality check check if what you have in Point 5 is in agreement with your understanding of what is required (Point 3).
- 7. Modify where necessary.
- 8. Now you can start "writing" the essay by connecting the material you have put together in Point 7.
- 9. Review for connectivity and revise.
- 10. Put through grammar and spell checker. Read carefully / tweak.



#### **Letters to Professors – Turn Offs**

- My research interests match yours therefore ...
- I have read your paper and I am interested in your work ...
- I have been to your web site ...
- You are the greatest therefore I want to work with you ...
- Your institution is great therefore admit me and give me financial support
- I am really interested in research, but I only want a MS ...
- To a professor who has never published in X ...
   I have been to your website and see that my research interest Y matches yours ...
- When writing to a female professor.
   Dear Sir: I have been to your website and my research interest matches yours ...
- I plan to get a MS, work in industry and then come back and get a PhD ...

## Proper Preparation Promotes Positive Performance

- Seek to add value
- Demonstrate
  - Purpose, ability to plan, evaluate, and create solutions (multi-subject, analytical skills)
  - Grades and ability to overcome challenges, methodical (systematic)
  - Integrated approach to subjects + specialized focus on some
  - Learning and self-regulated: approach, strategise, evaluate, adapt enjoy work.
  - Teaching experience and contribution to those with less resources
  - Extra-curricular participation and organisation of events for others
  - Voluntary work your sector + other sector
  - Work experience your sector + allied area : implementing the knowledge
  - Reading, interpretation, risk assessment and change management
- Conclude Dedication and emotional resilience with aim to contribute harmony


